

## ENDANGERED NATIVE AMERICAN LANGUAGES CAMPAIGN COORDINATOR

Cultural Survival and Native American partners are launching a campaign to heighten awareness about the importance of revitalizing critically endangered Native American languages before they are lost forever. Target audiences will include tribal governments, foundations, corporations and businesses that employ or serve Native Americans, and Native American casino tribes. Funds raised as a result of the campaign will be used to provide direct support and technical assistance to critically endangered Native American language immersion schools and other language-learning programs.

Job responsibilities include:

- supporting and expanding an enduring partnership coalition for the revitalization of critically endangered Native American languages
- developing and implementing, with our partners, approaches for engaging and raising funds from each of the target audiences
- working with CS staff and partners to develop and disseminate appropriate outreach tools for each audience including brochures, media kits, "white papers," posters, and short videos/films
- working with CS staff and interns to maintain a website to support the campaign and endangered Native American language revitalization efforts

The ideal candidate will have experience working with tribal communities or national Native American organizations and be able to leverage those connections to raise support for revitalizing critically endangered Native American languages. S/he must have:

- outstanding people skills
  - outgoing
  - charismatic
  - energetic
  - leadership skills, but willingness to share leadership role (team player)
  - diplomacy
  - ability to bring together diverse constituencies for language revitalization
  - ability to work respectfully with all
- excellent oral and written communications skills
- ability to work independently
- willingness to travel extensively throughout Indian Country and to foundations
- driver's license
- ability to work well with our partners and our Oklahoma-based endangered languages leadership team

In addition, the ideal candidate will be a strong advocate for critically endangered language revitalization; have fund raising, organizing experience; have the capacity to manage relations with the media and to use the web creatively for outreach and advocacy; and the ability to supervise interns.

Bachelor's Degree in Communications, Public Relations, American Indian Studies, or related field. MA strongly preferred.
