

lages varies, and because regional differences exist, an additional grant to the larger villages based on the number of Natives on the village rolls should be made. The additional grant should be calculated on the basis of 500 acres per person, less the grant of four townships, or 92,160 acres. The additional grants of land should be limited to the "claim area" of the regional association in which the community is now located, as shown on the Bureau of Land Management's "Native Protest Map", but need not be contiguous.

2. Regional corporations should be established by the legislation. Each of these corporations should operate in an area roughly analogous to the area now covered by one of the following regional associations\*:

- (a) Arctic Slope Native Association  
(Barrow, Pt. Hope)
- (b) Bering Straits Association (Kotzebue, Seward Peninsula, Unalakleet, St. Lawrence Island)
