

the other Native groups on a population basis. When the compensation due those two groups is equal to the amount of money that has been offset, they should be permitted to share in accordance with the above ratios. Separate provisions are also required to deal with distribution to the Tyoneks.

2. AFN proposes that the \$500,000,000 be appropriated and deposited to the credit of the Natives by granting \$100,000,000 in the first year and \$50,000,000 each succeeding year for a period of eight years. Interest at the prevailing federal rate should be paid against unpaid balances.
3. Direct per capita distribution of any funds in excess of 20% of the amount received by any village or corporation should be prohibited. Each village, regional corporation and the statewide corporation should be authorized to expend, invest or distribute its funds to promote the advancement of the Native people in Alaska, subject to authorization by the appropriate governing body and approval by the Alaska Native Commission.
4. AFN proposes, in place of the provisions in S. 1830, which included terms that the Native people share in the revenues derived from certain sources, an overriding gross royalty of 2% of all proceeds from
