3 (b) (1) Any member of the Commission may sign and
4 issue subpoenas for the attendance and testimony of witnesses
5 and production of relevant papers, books, and documents,
6 and may administer oaths. Witnesses summoned before the
7 Commission shall be paid the same fees and mileage that are
8 paid witnesses in the courts of the United States. Any person
9 who fails to comply with a Commission subpoena shall be
10 subject to punishment in accordance with section 104 of
11 title 43, United States Code. The Commission may order
12 testimony to be taken by deposition in any proceeding before
13 it and in any stage of such proceeding after reasonable notice
14 is first given in writing by the party or his attorney of record,
15 which notice shall state the name of the witness and the
16 time and place of the taking of his deposition.

17 (2) The Commission shall have the power to call upon
18 any of the departments or agencies of the United States for
19 any information it may deem necessary for carrying out its
20 functions under this Act.

21 (3) In any hearing or other proceeding before the Com-
22 mission, any letter, paper, document, map, transcript or
23 record in the possession of any officer, department, agency or
24 court of the United States or committee of Congress (or a
