9 SEC. 10. (a) Public Land Order Numbered 4582, 34
10 Federal Register 1025, is hereby revoked.

11 (b) (1) There are hereby withdrawn, subject to valid
12 existing rights, from selection by the State and from all
13 forms of appropriation under the public land laws, includ-
14 ing the mining and mineral leasing laws, all public lands in
15 each township as shown on current plats of survey or pro-
16 traction diagrams of the Bureau of Land Management, or
17 protraction diagrams of the State where protraction diagrams
18 of the Bureau of Land Management are not available, which
19 encloses all or part of any Native village listed in subsection
20 (c) hereof, plus all public lands in each township which is
21 contiguous to or corners upon the township or townships in
22 which such Native village is located.
