We are happy to announce the 24th annual scholarship award program for Alaskan Native students who are presently attending high school in the Anchorage, Palmer and Wasilla districts. We have enclosed a pamphlet about our organization at the Alaska Native Medical Center to help you and your students learn about us.

Students are required to submit the completed application to the judging committee, not to the counseling office at their schools. If you wish, you may forward in one package all applications from your students, but we must receive them by the posted deadline which is April 20, 2007. Applications may be mailed, faxed, or hand delivered to the scholarship committee.

Again, this year we are asking that students show that they have applied, or have been accepted to a four year college or an accredited vocational school at the time of the interview. Time constraints permit us to interview only those students who are seriously intent on going to college and who are legitimate candidates for this award.

The Alaska Native Medical Center Auxiliary will award scholarships of up to \$1,000 each to selected Native students graduating from high school in 2007. To be considered for one of these awards, the student must:

1. Be a Native American eligible for services at the Alaska Native Medical Center
2. Provide a scholarship folder including:
  - a. Personal history
  - b. Official transcript
  - c. Summary of awards, activities, achievements
  - d. Statement of educational and career goals
  - e. Evidence of acceptance to a four year college or accredited vocational school
3. Have a personal interview with the judging committee
4. Attend a four year academic institution or an accredited Vocational school on a full time basis.  
(Minimum of 12 semester hours)

Applicants will be judged on:

1. Leadership abilities
2. Academic potential and achievement
3. Financial need
4. participation in Native culture groups and activities

Students must submit an official application to the judging committee no later than April 20, 2007. **NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE CONSIDERED** The scholarship folder will be reviewed at the interview and should not be submitted with the application. Interviews will be completed by May 4, 2007 and winners will be the guests of the Auxiliary at the Annual awards brunch.
