Battiste is an internationally renowned Mi'kmaw scholar, activist and educator from the Potlotek First Nation in Nova Scotia. With graduate degrees from Harvard and Stanford, she is a senior Indigenous scholar in Canada, among the first to have graduated with a doctorate degree. Her talk is co-sponsored by SHI and the Preparing Indigenous Teachers and Administrators for Alaska Schools program at the University of Alaska Southeast.
